**St. John's, NL, April 25, 2018** – Three years ago, the Canadian Cancer Society officially launched a program to support cancer patients in Labrador who have to travel outside the region for cancer care. The "Air Daffodil" program was introduced to help alleviate the overwhelming financial burden associated with travel costs out of Labrador.

Matthew Piercey, CEO of the Canadian Cancer Society-NL said that the need for this important support program has been clearly demonstrated. "Since the implementation of this program in 2015, the Canadian Cancer Society has provided 658 one-way flights supporting 310 clients from all parts of Labrador. We are very grateful to PAL Airlines and Air Borealis for recognizing the good that this program is doing for cancer patients in Labrador by extending their support," says Piercey. The airline offers in-kind travel as well as flexible medical fares to the Society's "Air Daffodil" initiative. Mr. Piercey says, "Sponsorship of our support programs is integral to their success.
