

Information for Passengers—Provincial Measures

In order to manage the spread of COVID-19, the Governments of Quebec, New Brunswick and of Newfoundland and Labrador have imposed certain restrictions on travel. Please be aware that you may be subject to a measure to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at your destination. You may also be required to complete a declaration, including a credible plan to complete the required period of self-isolation, prior to arrival at your destination.

By travelling on PAL Airlines, you are certifying that you are aware of and in compliance with all relevant restrictions at your destination. If you are not in compliance with relevant restrictions at your destination, PAL Airlines reserves the right to deny boarding.

Information for Passengers—Travelling within the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador

Information for Passengers—Travelling to Newfoundland and Labrador from Outside the Province

In order to minimize the spread of COVID-19, all passengers arriving in Newfoundland and Labrador are required to complete a declaration and self-isolation plan. This includes passengers arriving from other provinces and territories in Canada.

Passengers are asked to complete the declaration form and self-isolation plan prior to or on arrival in the province. The form for passengers arriving by air can be viewed here:

The Chief Medical Officer of Health for Newfoundland and Labrador issued a Special Measures Order ordering that only individuals permitted to enter the province are those who are:

1. Residents of Newfoundland and Labrador;
2. Asymptomatic workers and individuals who are subject to the Updated Self-Isolation Exemption Order effective November 27, 2020; and
3. Individuals who have been permitted entry to the province in extenuating circumstances, as approved in advance by the Chief Medical Officer of Health.
