



## COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for Travel to Remote Communities

**Effective November 30, 2021**, all travellers 12 years and 4 months of age and older who reside in one of the Transport Canada approved isolated communities and are travelling on any PAL Airlines flight to a remote community via a gateway airport are required to produce one of the following:

- All Passengers 12 years and 4 months of age and older will be required to provide confirmation of vaccination, with the last dose having been received at least 14 full days prior to the day you travel. Those 18 years of age and older will also have to show a government issued photo ID or two pieces of non-photo government issued ID; **or**
- A negative PCR test taken 72 hours prior to **scheduled** departure time, along with photo ID or two pieces of non-photo government issued ID;
- Valid paper documents showing proof of vaccination, along with a photo ID or two pieces of non-photo government issued ID;
- Proof of a positive COVID-19 PCR test, taken between 14 and 180 days before your scheduled departure;
- Name(s) on reservation must match the government issued ID, as well as the name listed on the proof of vaccination/QR code;
- Travellers younger than 12 years and 4 months of age will take on the vaccination status of the parent or guardian travelling with them;
- Self-administered COVID-19 PCR tests will be available to passengers whose permanent residence falls under the category of the Transport Canada approved isolated communities **ONLY**. They will be available at all gateway airports and all major CATSA airports;
- Unvaccinated and non-exempt passengers residing in isolated communities are able to travel to gateway airports, however, will **NOT** be able to depart without proof of a negative self-administered PCR COVID-19 test and/or one of the above requirements.

**Residents from remote communities who cannot provide a valid proof of vaccination will be required to take a self-administered instant COVID-19 test prior to their departing flight from a gateway airport; proof of vaccination is not required when leaving a remote community.**

**We kindly ask passengers connecting through a gateway airport who is required to take a self administered PCR COVID-19 test to arrive 90 minutes prior their scheduled departure time to deliver the completed test results.**

It is important that all travellers confirm the name on their government issued photo ID or two pieces of non-photo government issued ID, as well as the name listed on the proof of vaccination/QR code correctly match the name on the reservation. Travellers younger than 12 years and 4 months of age travelling on a PAL Airlines flight will take on the vaccination status of the parent or guardian travelling with them.

Travellers who provide false or misleading information may be subject to a fine of up to \$5,000.

**Effective November 30, 2021**, all travellers 12 years and 4 months of age and older travelling on any PAL Airlines flight will be required to produce one of the following:

- Proof of full vaccination;
- Proof of a medical or religious exemption with an approved negative PCR test.

The Government of Canada is currently reviewing requirements for travel to remote communities. As information around these new requirements becomes available, we will update our travel policies as soon as possible.
