



## How do I qualify as a fully vaccinated traveler in Canada?

There are still restrictions for travel within Canada. **Starting November 30, 2021**, all travellers 12 years and 4 months of age and older flying on commercial passenger aircraft will need to be fully vaccinated to board domestic or international flights departing Canadian airports.

To qualify as a fully vaccinated traveller within Canada, you must:

- have received at least two doses of a Government of Canada-accepted COVID-19 vaccine or a mix of two accepted vaccines
  - or at least 1 dose of the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccine

- have received your second dose at least 14 full days prior to the day you travel
  - Example: if your second dose was anytime on Thursday July 1, then Friday July 16 would be the first day that you meet the 14-day condition;
- have no signs or symptoms of COVID-19;
- bring official proof of vaccination with you for your trip
